

Registration Guide – Used Super SOCO CUx Scooters

The standard RDW procedure for requesting a replacement registration certificate does not apply to these scooters. As the scooter is currently still registered in the name of Go Sharing, it must first be transferred into your name by the Netherlands Vehicle Authority (RDW). Only after this process has been completed can the registration documents be issued. Please follow the steps below.

Step 1 – Submit an application to the RDW

- Using the contact form on the RDW website (Contact → Send a message via the contact form); or
- Sending an email to vvk@rdw.nl.

Step 2 – Attach the required documents

- The invoice issued by Dome Auctions;
- The Deed of Assignment – an official document issued by the bankruptcy trustee confirming that the vehicle has been allocated and legally transferred to you. You will receive this document when collecting the vehicle.

Step 3 – Clearly state in your request

- You wish to register the scooter in your name;
- The scooter originates from the bankruptcy of Go Sharing;
- Your application is based on the attached Deed of Assignment.

Step 4 – Wait for the RDW's assessment

Once your application has been received, the RDW will review your file. Depending on your specific situation, the RDW may request additional documents, information, or further steps before the registration can be completed.

Important

- Keep your Dome Auctions invoice and the Deed of Assignment in a safe place.
- As these scooters are sold through a bankruptcy auction, no registration certificate or Certificate of Conformity (CoC) is available. Instead, you will receive a Deed of Assignment, linked to the scooter's VIN/chassis number.
- No licence plate is supplied with these scooters. Once the registration has been completed, you can have a licence plate manufactured by an RDW-authorised licence plate manufacturer.
- These instructions are based on the standard registration procedure for these scooters. In some cases, the RDW may determine that a scooter has previously been exported or is already registered abroad. If this is the case, a different registration or import procedure may apply. Any additional requirements, procedures, and associated costs are the responsibility of the buyer.
- Dome Auctions and the bankruptcy trustee have no insight into the handling of individual applications and are not responsible for the registration process, the associated costs, processing times, or the outcome of any application.
